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## What you should know about nominating as Chairman, Treasurer or Ordinary Councillor of Sydney Bridge Club Limited.

Sydney Bridge Club Limited is a corporation under the [Corporations Act 2001](#). As such, becoming Chairman, Treasurer or Ordinary Councillor means that you take on the duties of a company director.

From November 2021, there is a requirement for directors to apply for a unique identification number (Director ID).

The current Council takes its responsibilities seriously, and has taken the following steps towards ensuring it is well placed to effectively govern the Sydney Bridge Club:

1. Adopted the Australian Institute of Company Directors governance principles for not-for-profit organisations (“2024 Not-for-Profit Governance Principles – Third Edition”)
2. Established a skills and experience matrix and pro-actively sought out relevant individuals to put themselves forward to join the Council or fill casual vacancies

Whilst it is not a requirement under the current Constitution, this is a summary of the skills that the current Council believes it requires to operate effectively:

If you have any of these skills and experience, we encourage you to put yourself forward to join the Council. The current Council has identified skills gaps in Marketing, Communications, Social Media and Competitive Bridge Experience.

Council currently meets twice per month and Councillors spend time outside of meetings attending to matters within the portfolios they hold accountability for. Many also volunteer their time to assist with the smooth running of the club. The time commitment is highly variable but is expected to reduce as the changes arising from separation from Bridge NSW become routine.
